What are apprenticeships?

An apprenticeship combines learning and working. Apprenticeships offer structured courses of study that lead to qualifications whilst actually working and being paid to do a job. Anyone aged 16 or over can apply for an apprenticeship. They last a minimum of 12 months to 4 years, and are available in 170 industries.

Apprenticeships can lead on to Higher Education or full-time employment.

Types of apprenticeship:

Intermediate - equivalent to 5 GCSE passes

Advanced - equivalent to 2 A-levels (Link 1 below)

Higher - can lead to NVQ level 4 or above, or to a foundation degree. (link 2 below)
