It has been an excellent start to the new academic year, and we are particularly excited by our growing range of enrichment opportunities for students in all year groups. Research shows that participation in clubs and activities outside of the normal school curriculum have a huge impact on both wellbeing and academic achievement, and we are keen to support this as much as possible here at Carshalton Boys.

This term our year 7 and 8 students are able to participate in over 30 different enrichment opportunities outside of school hours, both sporting and non-sporting. 

Sora E-book library launches at CBSC!

In September, CBSC launched a new digital library called [Sora Overdrive](#).


Sora is a free app that allows students to access thousands of ebooks and audiobooks from the school library on their laptops, tablets, and smartphones.

To use Sora Overdrive, students simply need to download the app and log in with their school Google account. Once they are logged in, they can browse the library's collection of ebooks and audiobooks and borrow titles with a single click.

Sora Overdrive offers a wide variety of ebooks and audiobooks, including fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels and educational titles. Students can also use the app to create reading lists, bookmark pages, and share titles with friends.

The launch of Sora Overdrive will provide students with access to a vast collection of digital resources and make it easier for them to find and read books that they are interested in.

The Sora app is easy to use and navigate, and students can access it from anywhere with an internet connection. We encourage all students to try out Sora and see what it has to offer!

Kenya Expedition 2025

Following our hugely successful expedition to Costa Rica in July, we are so excited to launch the next expedition that will take place to Kenya in 2025. This fantastic opportunity is open to present year 9s, 10s, 11s and 12s and offers the experience of spending 4 weeks in Kenya working on wildlife and community projects. Kenya is a developing country where less than half the population have access to drinking water and so the community work that our students do is so worthwhile. The adventure part of the expedition is scuba diving (students can gain a PADI qualification) and safari. Fundraising is an important part of the expedition and we support our students who are committed in many ways, for example, by offering opportunities to earn some steady money at school. 

Another round of applause is in order, this time for our students who have achieved the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh award. What a fantastic achievement! This recognition speaks volumes about your commitment, teamwork, and resilience. Well done to all the students who received this prestigious award, and we look forward to witnessing more of your accomplishments in the future.

Another highlight was the Malaga trip, which was an eye-opening experience for our students. They had a remarkable time and gained valuable insights during their visit. We're thrilled that they had such a great time and that experiences like these contribute to their personal growth.

As a gentle reminder, it's important to note that trainers are not considered a part of the school uniform. Additionally, our Year 10 students are growing older and should adhere to the dress code by wearing a black tie, maintaining a sense of uniformity and maturity.

Finally, starting after the half-term break, students who do not complete their WOTC or submit work that is of a low quality and does not meet the required standard for their ability, will be required to attend a compulsory one-hour WOTC intervention on the same day. Please note that these interventions are compulsory and cannot be changed or rescheduled.

Before these compulsory interventions, students will be expected to hand in their mobile phones and spend the time focusing exclusively on completing their WOTC assignments. Even if they complete the work ahead of the intervention, they will still be required to sit the full one hour after school. This will provide a structured and distraction-free environment for them to concentrate on their work, ensuring that they meet the necessary standards and make the most of their learning opportunities.

We have made it to half term – yay! It has been a tough start to this academic year but you have risen to the challenge and the progress you have made is admirable. I am so proud of the aspirations you have set yourself and the hard work you are putting in to achieve these.

Half term is a time to reset and refresh ready for the challenges of the next half term. This break also offers a golden opportunity to revise and get organised for your upcoming mock exams, which take place that first week back. Remember, your mock exams are used to inform teachers what they need to cover over the next few months and they highlight areas you need to prioritise. It is vital that you take these mocks seriously, prepare effectively and do your best.

Here are my top tips to help you revise effectively over the half term:

- Create a revision schedule: Make a plan using the template shared on CC. Be specific with what topics you will cover in each session so you do not miss any.
- Motivate yourself: Schedule in rewards to keep you motivated. Make sure you only reward yourself if you achieve your revision goal for that day!
- Create a study space: Try to create a dedicated space for your revision. Make sure it is quiet, well lit, tidy and fully stocked with resources.
- Minimise distractions: Turn off your TV, console and notifications on your phone whilst revising.
- Self-test and regular review: Once you have revised a topic, make sure you regularly test yourself on what you have covered to ensure it has stuck in your brain.
- Stay healthy: Make sure you are getting enough sleep and are taking breaks for exercise to help keep you healthy and focussed.

My biggest tip of all is to stay positive. You are an incredible group of students with the potential to achieve amazing things. There will be times when you feel overwhelmed or disheartened, but remember that you are capable of anything you put your mind to.

Academic Update

Firstly I would like to congratulate year 12 on making such a strong start to their sixth form journey. The transition from GCSE to Level 3 study is a difficult one and every student has really begun to make significant progress on that step up to KS5 study. At the end of this first half term students are fully embedded into the sixth form community and have had several study skills sessions to support their new pathways. Students are starting to gain real traction in their progress and enjoying developing their existing knowledge at a deeper level or enjoying new subjects that they didn't have the opportunity to study prior to KS5.

We are currently collecting attitude to learning data which will be shared with you once completed. This will then help inform who in the student community needs some additional support from the sixth form team and our academic mentors. In addition I had the privilege of sending home postcards to some of our students who were recognised by departments as making a strong start. A regular comment from department heads was that students have been enthusiastic in lessons and work has been up to an amazing standard. Well done Year 12!

Trips & Events

Several of our year 12 students have already signed up for some of the "Futures Thursday" opportunities. These range from taster lectures at university, academic mentoring programmes and virtual work experiences. Many of our students have signed up for the first UCAS experience visit in November and proved so popular we have opened a waiting list for this trip. Please be reassured we will run several trips during the course of the year to ensure all students can access the same opportunities.

This half term year 12 music students have been working hard to stage their concert at the soundlounge in Sutton and other departments have already starting organising trips and events to support the students on their academic journey. Thank you for all your support as parents and carers for your contributions to all the trips we run as this really does add value to the sixth form academic journey.



Pastoral Update

We have spent lots of time this half term settling in our new Y12 students who have made an amazing start to 6th form. Assemblies have focussed on managing transition across both cohorts as well as looking at what support services are available both within schools and the external agencies we have links with. All students have been invited to join a Pastoral Classroom on Google where they can access links and resources to Daily Notices, Assemblies, NDTD, Whizz Quiz Wednesday info, Futures Thursday and much more. The most recent PSHE session looked at stress and ways of coping with it in different scenarios. Some research has shown that saying 'I am excited' when you are confronted by a difficult task or scenario and other research suggests that calming music and meditation can be a real relief.


We have our first set of mock exams in the week beginning 13th November and I know students will show a tremendous amount of progress in a short space of time. Over half term students should be revising strategically to prepare as well as getting a well deserved rest.

We have been putting in some support for students with bespoke academic mentoring, plugging students into external tutoring to support progress and running personalised intervention strategies. We also have been running a weekly ASPIRE session working on skills around exam vocabulary to make those marginal gains that are crucial for the top grades.

There is also parents evening next half term when we can share and celebrate their progress to date and what the crucial next steps are to secure grades. We look forward to seeing you all in person then.

Pastoral Update

This half term we have welcomed back a very driven and motivated Y13, many of whom are deep in exam preparation and UCAS mode. We continue to support students with exam concessions, help & advice and guidance across a range of topics. PSHE sessions have focussed on UCAS and Job Seeker opportunities and assemblies have looked at embedding the transition to Y13 and the support services available. 

NHS Allied Work Experience

Years 10-13

Health Education England has recently completed a discovery report on virtual work experience programmes, which have concluded that these programmes are a valuable adjunct to in-person work experience, especially by preparing students for in-person placements and where in-person experiences are extremely limited. The NHS Allied Healthcare Work Experience successfully invited 12,000 students to participate in the last academic year, making it the largest programme for students who are specifically interested in the following careers:

- Nursing
- Midwifery
- Paramedicine
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Dietetics
- Radiography
- Prosthetics and Orthotics
- Speech and language therapy and Pharmacy!



Applications for this programme are now open, and they will be open throughout this academic year, with the next virtual work experience day taking place on the 5th November.

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching.

This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Each work experience day is completely different, and students will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community.

Students will also receive certificates as evidence of having participated in the work experience programme. Those that complete the entire 6-month programme will be awarded with Highly Commended References too. Students can register individually through the website link below. Places are £10 a day to cover administrative costs and run the tech on the day.


